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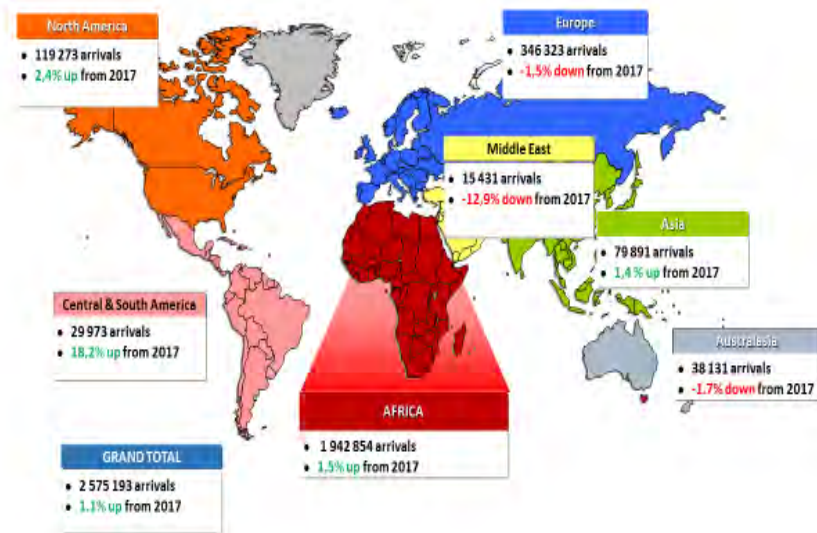
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INBOUND TOURISM PERFORMANCE

TOURIST ARRIVALS BY REGION (JUL-SEPT 2018)

A total of 2 575 193 tourist arrivals was recorded for the period Jul-Sept 2018, which was an increase of 1.1% compared to the same period in 2017. Most regions recorded an increase in tourist arrivals during this period. Central and South America recorded the highest increase (18.2%), followed by North America (2.4%), Africa (1.5%) and Asia (1.4%). Regions that recorded a decline were Middle East (-12.9%), Australasia (-1.7%) and Europe (-1.5%).

TOP 5 OVERSEAS AND AFRICAN SOURCE MARKETS (JUL-SEPT 2018)

Most of the top five overseas source markets recorded a decline during the period Jul-Sept 2018 compared to same period in 2017. Germany and USA recorded an increase of 3.0% and 2.4% respectively. Overseas markets that recorded a decline were the Netherlands (-12.1%), France (-5.3%) and UK (-3.1%). Most of the top five African source markets also recorded a decline in tourist arrivals during the same period under review. Zimbabwe and Lesotho had an increase of 5.7% and 0.02% respectively, whilst Swaziland had the highest decline of -2.8% followed by Mozambique (-1.2%) and Botswana (-1.1%).

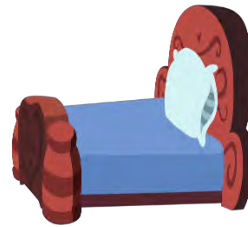

For the period Jul-Sept 2018, total passenger movements recorded an increase of 1.1% compared to the same period in 2017. Both domestic and international passenger movements recorded an increase of 0.6% and 2.7% respectively for the same period.

Accommodation Industry

The accommodation industry recorded a total income of R5.955.4 million for the period Jul-Sept 2018, which was an increase of 2.2% compared to the same period of the previous year.

The food and beverages industry recorded a positive growth of 1.3% on income for the period July-Sept 2018 compared to Jul-Sept 2017.

SOUTH AFRICAN TOURISM EMPLOYMENT ESTIMATES (JUL-SEPT 2018)

For the period Jul-Sept 2018 there was an estimated total of 786 964 workers directly employed within the tourism sector. The tourism sector contributed about 4.5% to the country's total employment, which was an increase of 7.8% compared to the same period in 2017.
